
Patricia G. Velarde/ Housekeeping

Legislative Session Recap

This year's Legislative Session started on January 18th and it was another busy session for our Legislators. This year's session was available to the public in person and virtually. Disability Advocacy Day was on January 19th which was a virtual event. This year consumers and staff were able to attend this event and learn more about the most effective ways to communicate their issues with their elected officials. Also January 25th was Transit Day on the Hill where UTA announced that all of UTA's public transportation will be free to the public during



the month of February. The LCPD Reception was cancelled in January and rescheduled for February 14th which was held in person and virtually. This was also an awesome opportunity for people with disabilities to have their issues and voices be heard by their legislators who can and do make a difference in our state. Also during this session the Independent Living Program submitted a request for ongoing funding with Senator Weiler. The funding request was for \$900,000 for the six centers for independent living to be split equally. This funding will assist the centers in maintaining current levels of funding for youth transition services, ages 5-24, and to maintain current levels of services for center programs. Another funding request was for \$300,000 submitted for Ability 1st Utah by Senator Anderegg for the building remodel to install an elevator and accessible bathroom to increased access to the lower floor of our center. We are hoping that we will receive this funding to assist us in making our center more fully accessible to the consumers that we serve.

I'd like to express my gratitude for all of the support for Ability 1st Utah throughout our 21 years of service. Please do not hesitate to let us know if you would like to get involved in any of the center activities. I wish all of you the very best this year and thank you so much for your continued support!

La Sesión Legislativa de este año comenzó el 18 de enero y fue otra sesión ocupada para nuestros Legisladores. La sesión de este año estuvo disponible para el público en persona y virtualmente. El Día de la Defensa de la Discapacidad fue el 19 de enero y fue un evento virtual. Este año, los consumidores y el personal pudieron asistir a este evento y aprender más sobre las formas más efectivas de comunicar sus problemas a los funcionarios electos. También el 25 de enero fue el Día del Tránsito en la Colina, donde UTA anunció que todo el transporte público de UTA será gratuito para el público durante el mes de febrero. La recepción de LCPD se canceló en enero y se reprogramó para el 14 de febrero, que se llevó a cabo de manera presencial y virtual. Esta también fue una gran oportunidad para que las personas con discapacidades hicieran escuchar sus problemas y voces por parte de los legisladores que pueden marcar una diferencia en nuestro estado y lo hacen. También durante esta sesión, el Programa de Vida Independiente presentó una solicitud de financiamiento continuo con el Senador Weiler. La solicitud de financiamiento fue de \$900,000 para los seis centros de vida independiente que se dividirán en partes iguales. Esta financiación ayudará a los centros a mantener los niveles actuales de financiación para los servicios de transición para jóvenes, de 5 a 24 años, y para mantener los niveles actuales de servicios para los programas del centro. Otra solicitud de financiamiento fue de \$300,000 presentada para Ability 1st Utah por el Senador Anderegg para la remodelación del edificio para instalar un ascensor y un baño accesible para aumentar el acceso al piso inferior de nuestro centro. Esperamos recibir estos fondos para ayudarnos a hacer que nuestro centro sea más accesible para los consumidores a los que servimos.
