Independent Living Services

Ability 1st Utah provides five core services that every center for independent living is required to provide. These services are available to all individuals that have a physical, mental, cognitive or sensory disability at no cost. The core services are (1) Advocacy, individual and systems change, (2) Peer Support, (3) Information and Referral, (4) Independent Living Skills Training, (5) Transition for youth with disabilities and nursing home and institutional transition. A few of these services will be highlighted below:

Youth Transition

Ability 1st Utah's staff works with youth ages 5 to 24 and older youth up to age 30 with transition services. The transition services helps youth with disabilities to prepare for employment, higher education and community living. Ability 1st Utah's staff works with youth in learning skills they have requested, to help them achieve greater independence. These services are provided in the Schools and at the center.

Nursing Home Transition

Ability 1st Utah's staff works with individuals with disabilities who reside in a nursing home or other institutions and have requested assistance to move back to their community. Staff will work with each individual to identify their specific needs and what community resources are available and necessary for their transition. Our staff can provide support services in many different ways and here are a few:

Developing a transition plan Obtaining Personal Assistance Services and Nursing Services Applying for Benefits through the Wavier programs Identifying and acquiring Accessible and Affordable housing Acquiring Assistive Technology Acquiring funding for Home Accessibility modifications Independent Living Skills training Advocacy Community integration activities



Independent Living Skills Training

Independent Living skills are taught at the center, and classes are scheduled through feedback received from individuals with disabilities such as:

Budgeting & Finances Shopping on a budget Workplace readiness skills Cooking classes Accessing public Transportation/Travel Training Social Recreation skills & Social Relationships Self-Care- Hygiene and safety Laundry
